Unimus Electrical Engineering Students Secure PKM-PI 2025 Funding to Support SMEs through Appropriate Oil Spinner Technology

A team of Electrical Engineering students from Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang (UNIMUS), led by **Daffa Abdur Rosyid** under the supervision of **Laily Muntasiroh, S.T., M.T.**, has successfully secured funding under the **2025 Student Creativity Program in the Implementation of Science and Technology (PKM-PI)**. The funded project, entitled *"Implementation of Appropriate Oil Spinner Technology,"* aims to enhance the productivity and competitiveness of small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) through the application of simple, affordable, and practical technological innovations.



The program will be implemented in collaboration with **Barokah Snack**, a local SME owned by **Mrs. Rahayu** and located in **Surokonto Wetan Village, Kendal Regency, Central Java**. The enterprise specializes in producing a variety of fried snack products and faces challenges related to excessive residual oil content, which affects product quality, shelf life, and market competitiveness.

To address this issue, the UNIMUS student team developed an **energy-efficient oil spinner** capable of effectively reducing the residual oil content in fried food products. Powered by a low-energy electric motor, the equipment is designed to be user-friendly, cost-effective, and suitable for adoption by small-scale food producers.

According to the project supervisor, **Laily Muntasiroh**, the PKM-PI program encourages students to identify real-world challenges within local communities and develop innovative solutions grounded in science and technology. "Through the PKM-PI program, students are encouraged to identify community-based problems and provide practical solutions founded on scientific knowledge and technological innovation. We hope this technology will improve the quality of our partner's products while strengthening the long-term sustainability of their business."

This achievement reflects Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang's continued commitment to strengthening collaboration between higher education institutions and society through the implementation of the **Tri Dharma of**



Higher Education, particularly in the area of community engagement driven by scientific innovation and technological advancement.

International Collaboration in the 2025 Summer Course on Marine Ecology and Biosystematics

The Undergraduate Marine Science Study Program of the Faculty of Agricultural Science and Technology (FSTP), Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang (UNIMUS), successfully organized the **2025 Summer Course** entitled *"International Collaborative Scientific Discussions on Marine Ecology and Biosystematics."* This academic program was conducted through an international collaboration involving the **Ecology and Biosystematics Laboratory, Department of Biology, Faculty of Science and Mathematics, Universitas Diponegoro (UNDIP)**, and the **National University of Singapore (NUS)**.



The opening ceremony was held on **8 May 2025** in the Lecture Hall of the Integrated Classroom Building II at UNIMUS. The event was attended by the Dean of FSTP, **Dr. Nur Hidajah**, the Head of the Marine Science Study Program, **Hanityo Adi Nugroho**, academic staff, and 23 undergraduate Marine Science students, along with other participants enrolled in the program.

The Summer Course took place from **8–15 May 2025** in **Semarang and Karimunjawa**, bringing together marine scientists and researchers from Indonesia and abroad, as well as students from **Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, and several Middle Eastern countries**.

In her opening remarks, **Dr. Nur Hidajah** expressed her appreciation for the successful implementation of the program and emphasized the significance of international academic collaboration. "We highly appreciate the Marine Science Study Program for establishing international partnerships with Universitas Diponegoro and the National University of Singapore. This initiative not only strengthens the academic capacity of both students and lecturers but also enhances the international reputation of the Faculty and the University. We hope that this collaboration will serve as the foundation for broader and more sustainable international partnerships".

One of the lecturers from the Marine Science Study Program, **Aulia Seto Sandhi Sanova, M.Si.**, explained that the Summer Course aimed to introduce participants to contemporary approaches for marine biodiversity assessment



and ecological monitoring, particularly through the application of **environmental DNA (eDNA)** and **Autonomous Reef Monitoring Structures (ARMS)**.

According to him, the program also represents part of an ongoing collaboration with the National University of Singapore to promote molecular approaches in marine ecological research, especially the integration of **eDNA analysis** and **ARMS technology** for biodiversity monitoring.

Following the opening ceremony, participants attended a scientific discussion featuring two invited experts: **Dr. Ni Kadek Dita Cahyani** from University of Diponegoro and **Angka Mahardini, S.Kel., M.Sc., Ph.D.** from Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang. The speakers presented recent developments in the application of eDNA and ARMS technologies for marine ecology research and marine biosystematics.

On **9 May 2025**, participants continued the program with a field expedition to **Karimunjawa National Park**, departing from Jepara Port. During the fieldwork, participants conducted hands-on sampling using ARMS installations and environmental DNA techniques. The collected samples were subsequently analyzed and discussed collaboratively as part of the program's scientific activities. The Summer Course concluded on **15 May 2025** with a final scientific discussion in Semarang, providing participants with an opportunity to evaluate field observations, exchange research findings, and strengthen international academic networking in the fields of marine ecology and biosystematics.

UNIMUS Nutrition Study Program Holds Healthy Exercise Event to Commemorate National Nutrition Day 2025

In celebration of **National Nutrition Day 2025**, the Nutrition Study Program of Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang (UNIMUS) organized a **Healthy Exercise Program** aimed at promoting healthy lifestyles and increasing public awareness of balanced nutrition. The event was held at the courtyard of **UNIMUS Mart** and brought together university leaders, academic staff, students, and members of the university community.

Fun with Chemistry 2025: Promoting Science Learning through Interactive and Educational Activities

The Chemistry Education Study Program of Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang (UNIMUS) successfully organized its annual semester-break educational event, **Fun with Chemistry 2025**, at the Integrated Classroom Building II, UNIMUS. The program was designed to introduce young learners to scientific concepts, particularly chemistry, through engaging, interactive, and enjoyable learning experiences. Approximately **30 kindergarten and elementary school students** participated in the event.



The program featured a variety of hands-on scientific activities, including **Science Shows** and **Self-Experiment Sessions**, enabling participants to directly observe and perform simple scientific experiments. Throughout the activities, the students demonstrated remarkable enthusiasm by actively participating in discussions and asking questions regarding the scientific principles underlying each experiment.

One of the event's highlights was the **ecoprint workshop**, where participants learned how naturally occurring pigments from leaves and flowers can be transferred onto fabric. During this session, lecturers from the Chemistry Education Study Program, together with student committee members, explained the chemical processes involved in producing natural textile patterns and emphasized the environmental advantages of sustainable dyeing techniques.

According to **Dr. Yusrin, M.Pd.**, Head of the Undergraduate Chemistry Education Study Program, the primary objective of the event was to cultivate scientific curiosity among children while demonstrating the relevance of chemistry in everyday life. "Through *Fun with Chemistry*, we aim not only to provide an enjoyable learning experience but also to inspire children to appreciate science, particularly chemistry, as a discipline that plays a significant role in everyday life and contributes to solving real-world problems."



Beyond stimulating curiosity, the event provided participants with valuable experiential learning opportunities. Each participant was able to take home the products created during the practical sessions, including their own ecoprinted fabric, illustrating that scientific knowledge can be applied creatively in daily life while also offering environmentally sustainable entrepreneurial opportunities.



As an inaugural initiative, **Fun with Chemistry** is expected to evolve into an annual outreach program with broader participation, particularly from junior and senior high school students. The program reflects UNIMUS's commitment to strengthening science literacy among younger generations by fostering interest in science through innovative and experiential learning approaches.

Through activities such as *Fun with Chemistry*, Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang continues to promote community engagement and science education while encouraging future generations to pursue scientific knowledge and innovation for sustainable societal development.

UNIMUS Launches the Educational Waqf Forest through Collaboration with LHKP PP Muhammadiyah and LATIN

Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang (UNIMUS) officially inaugurated the **Educational Waqf Forest**, marking a significant milestone in its commitment to environmental sustainability through waqf-based conservation. The initiative was established through a strategic partnership with the **Institute for Public Policy and Wisdom (LHKP) of Muhammadiyah Central Board** and the **Indonesian Tropical Nature Foundation (LATIN)**. The launching ceremony was held on the UNIMUS campus on **1 September 2025**.



The event was attended by distinguished representatives from Muhammadiyah, including **Dr. M. Busyro Muqoddas**, Chair of the Muhammadiyah Central Board; **Dr. Ridho Al-Hamdi**, Chair of LHKP PP Muhammadiyah; **Ir. Syafii Latuconsina**, Member of the Expert Council of the Muhammadiyah Community Empowerment Assembly; representatives of the Central Java Regional Board of 'Aisyiyah; and leaders of several Muhammadiyah regional branches. The ceremony was also attended by the University Rector, vice rectors, deans, faculty members, administrative staff, and students of UNIMUS.



The Educational Waqf Forest has been established on approximately **3,000 square meters** of university-owned waqf land. The area is planned to function not only as a productive green space but also as a **living laboratory** for education, research, and community engagement. The initiative is intended to serve as a model for sustainable forest management based on Islamic values, community empowerment, and environmental stewardship.



In his remarks, **Prof. Dr. Masruki, M.Pd.**, Rector of UNIMUS, emphasized that the collaboration reflects Muhammadiyah's commitment to ecological restoration and the productive utilization of waqf assets. "Through this initiative, we seek to revitalize underutilized waqf land by transforming it into productive green spaces that contribute to environmental conservation. The Educational Waqf Forest represents our commitment to preserving Indonesia's natural environment while maximizing the social and ecological benefits of waqf. Today's symbolic tree planting marks the beginning of this long-term commitment."



The initiative also received strong support from the **Central Java Provincial Office of Environment and Forestry**, represented by **Mahfud Munajad**, who highlighted the broader significance of the program. "The Educational Waqf Forest represents not only a spiritually meaningful initiative but also a strategic approach to forest rehabilitation in Indonesia, particularly in Central Java. We are committed to collaborating with Muhammadiyah and UNIMUS in providing tree seedlings and empowering local communities living around forest areas."



Meanwhile, **Dr. M. Busyro Muqoddas** stressed the importance of cross-sector collaboration in promoting environmental justice and sustainable natural resource management. "The Educational Waqf Forest symbolizes Muhammadiyah's concrete commitment to creating a healthy, prosperous, and environmentally sustainable society. Through ethical collaboration involving academic institutions, civil society organizations, government agencies, and local communities, Muhammadiyah seeks to contribute meaningful solutions to Indonesia's forestry and environmental challenges."



The launching ceremony included a presentation of the Educational Waqf Forest master plan, a symbolic tree-planting activity, and a thematic panel discussion involving Muhammadiyah leaders, academics, and environmental practitioners. The discussion explored strategic issues related to natural resource governance, restorative economics, social forestry, and rights-based environmental policies.



The event also featured the signing of several collaborative agreements, including a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between UNIMUS, LATIN, and LHKP, as well as cooperation agreements involving the Faculty of Economics and Business and the Agribusiness Study Program to support future research, education, and community development initiatives.



The establishment of the Educational Waqf Forest marks the initial step toward developing a Muhammadiyah epistemic community dedicated to social forestry and environmental justice. In the long term, the initiative is expected to become a **national model for waqf-based environmental conservation**, fostering interdisciplinary collaboration among universities, governmental institutions, non-governmental organizations, religious organizations, environmental activists, and local communities in advancing sustainable development.

Learning Sustainable Waste Management: IMM Asy-Syifa Conducts a Study Visit to the MLH PWM Central Java Laboratory

As part of its commitment to strengthening environmental awareness and community engagement, the **PPK ORMAWA IMM Asy-Syifa Team** of Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang (UNIMUS) conducted an educational study visit to the laboratory of the **Environmental Council (Majelis Lingkungan Hidup/MLH) of the Central Java Regional Board of Muhammadiyah (PWM)**, located in Pati Regency, Central Java, on 2 August 2025.

The visit was designed to enhance participants' knowledge and practical understanding of sustainable waste management systems and the application of **bioreactor technology** developed by the Environmental Council.

Through this activity, student participants were introduced to innovative yet accessible technologies that can be implemented at the community level to address household waste management challenges.



The delegation was welcomed by **Dr. Muchammad Sobri, S.Pt., M.P.**, Chair of the Environmental Council of PWM Central Java, together with his team. During the introductory session, Dr. Sobri presented a range of simple, practical, and environmentally friendly technologies that have been developed to improve household waste management practices.



According to Dr. Sobri, effective waste management contributes not only to environmental sustainability but also to improving the quality of life of households, particularly by reducing the burden on family members who are primarily responsible for managing domestic waste. "Appropriate and user-friendly technologies enable household waste to be managed more efficiently and practically. When managed properly, waste should not be regarded as a burden but rather as a valuable resource with significant environmental and economic potential."

During the visit, participants were introduced to several technological innovations, including an **automated irrigation system** capable of remotely controlling watering schedules and water dosage to improve agricultural efficiency. The team also demonstrated an innovative composting method requiring minimal water usage. Unlike conventional composting techniques that typically utilize multiple containers, the improved system allows compost



production using a single container through a streamlined process involving organic waste shredding, controlled fermentation, and compost maturation.

Following the technical presentations, participants toured the laboratory facilities to observe the operation of the **submarine bioreactor system**, an environmentally friendly technology designed for organic waste processing. The visit concluded with an interactive discussion, during which participants explored the technical aspects, implementation strategies, and potential applications of the technology in community-based environmental programs.

The study visit provided valuable insights and practical inspiration for the **PPK ORMAWA IMM Asy-Syifa Team**, particularly in supporting the development of the **Climate Village Program (Program Kampung Iklim)** in **Purwosari Village, Demak Regency**. By adapting the technologies and best practices introduced during the visit, the team aims to strengthen community participation in sustainable waste management, environmental conservation, and climate resilience. This initiative reflects Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang's continued commitment to experiential learning, community empowerment, and the promotion of environmentally sustainable technologies through collaborative partnerships with governmental and non-governmental institutions.

FKM UNIMUS Conducts Mangrove Planting Initiative to Strengthen Coastal Ecosystem Conservation

In commemoration of its **24th Anniversary**, the **Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang (UNIMUS)** organized a **mangrove planting initiative** at **Tirang Beach, Semarang**, as part of its commitment to environmental conservation and sustainable coastal ecosystem management. The activity reflects the faculty's dedication to mitigating the impacts of climate change while promoting environmental stewardship among members of the academic community.

Held under the theme "**FKM Plants: Caring for the Environment, Greening Nature**," the initiative involved **20 undergraduate students** and **six faculty members** from the Faculty of Public Health. Participants actively engaged in planting mangrove seedlings along the coastal area, which serves as a natural barrier against shoreline erosion and tidal flooding.



According to **Nurina Dyah Larasaty, S.KM., M.Kes.**, Coordinator of Student Affairs at the Faculty of Public Health, the activity represents a practical contribution by the faculty toward environmental sustainability while providing students with valuable experiential learning opportunities. "Our students demonstrated great enthusiasm throughout the activity. By participating directly in mangrove planting, they gained first-hand experience of the



ecological importance of mangrove forests in protecting coastal environments from erosion, tidal flooding, and other environmental challenges."

Meanwhile, the Dean of the Faculty of Public Health, **Dr. Sayono, S.KM., M.Kes. (Epid.)**, emphasized that mangrove restoration constitutes a tangible strategy for addressing the adverse impacts of climate change. "We are proud of our students' active participation in this environmental initiative. Mangrove planting is a practical and sustainable solution for preserving coastal ecosystems while strengthening community resilience to climate change. We hope this program will encourage broader public participation in environmental conservation."

Mangrove ecosystems provide numerous ecological services, including shoreline stabilization, prevention of coastal abrasion and tidal inundation, habitat provision for diverse marine organisms, and long-term carbon sequestration. Through this initiative, the Faculty of Public Health contributes to strengthening the resilience of Semarang's coastal ecosystems while supporting broader environmental sustainability objectives.

Beyond its immediate environmental impact, the program is expected to generate long-term ecological benefits for the conservation of Tirang Beach and surrounding coastal areas. Furthermore, the initiative seeks to enhance public awareness of the critical role of mangrove ecosystems in climate change mitigation, biodiversity conservation, and sustainable coastal management.

Through programs such as this, Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang reaffirms its commitment to integrating environmental education, community engagement, and sustainable development into its academic mission. The Faculty of Public Health remains committed to implementing educational and community-based initiatives that promote environmental health, ecological resilience, and the achievement of sustainable development goals.

2		The 2025 Student Creativity Program Grant is called EMONG. Interactive technology development activities, S1 Informatics. The activity took place from July to October. The program aims to establish five community learning centers for skill development, produce value-added corn-based MSME products, publish scientific articles, and create educational digital content. Being situated on the northern coastal area, the village frequently experiences <i>tidal flooding (rob)</i> as a result of climate change. These floods have disrupted local food security due to the submersion of agricultural land, rendering it unproductive. Additionally, ineffective waste management exacerbates environmental problems, even though household waste has the potential to be transformed into valuable products such as ecobricks, eco-enzyme, and organic compost that can serve as planting media. To address these challenges, the PPK ORMAWA IMM Asy-Syifa Team initiated the Climate Village Program (Kampung Iklim). The program introduces the “Ruang Iklim” (Climate Space) — an educational hub for environmental awareness integrated with two main initiatives: digital-based waste management and the establishment of community food resilience gardens. Furthermore, the formation of the Purwosari Climate Action Institute (LAIP) aims to ensure program sustainability and independence. The program's overarching goal is to enhance community awareness and active participation in combating climate change. The specific objectives include: 1. Establishing the Ruang Iklim as a community learning center on climate resilience. 2. Increasing public knowledge of climate village management. 3. Developing community skills in waste management to reduce waste accumulation in Purwosari Village. This initiative supports the implementation of Indonesia's Asta Cita Presidential Agenda, particularly points 2 and 8, and aligns with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): ● SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production,

Institutional strengthening ensures long-term sustainability, supported by partnerships with the Purwosari Village Government, Demak Environmental Agency (DLH), Sahabat Pecinta Alam Demak (PADe), MDMC Central Java, Lazismu Central Java, and the Muhammadiyah Council for Environmental Affairs (PWM Central Java). Overall, the Climate Village Program in Purwosari embodies a holistic, participatory approach to climate resilience, environmental education, and sustainable community development.

Objectives: • Increase the economic value of red guava through product diversification. • Enhance digital literacy and e-commerce use for local product marketing. • Improve farmers' income and business sustainability. Expected Outputs: • Reflection Book ("Harapan dari Lereng Ngargosari"). • Processed product prototypes, scientific articles, and media publications. • Training Module ("Red Guava and Its By-Products Processing Module"). • Poster, video documentation, and PIRT certification. • Strengthened BUMDes and sustained community entrepreneurship. Implementation: Activities include participatory workshops, digital marketing mentoring, and business management training, supported by local government and cross-sector partners. However, most of the harvest is sold raw at Rp19,000–Rp21,000/kg, without further processing or digital marketing, resulting in untapped economic potential. Through the Women's School Program by PPK Ormawa IMM Ahmad Dahlan, this initiative focuses on training in makeup artistry and red onion product processing, combined with entrepreneurship and digital marketing education. The program empowers women aged 18–45 to enhance their income, economic independence, and digital literacy. The outcomes include certified processed products, training modules, reflection books, video documentation, and scientific publications, implemented through the six pillars of empowerment (educate, engage, empower, entrepreneur, expand, establish). This program supports: ● SDG 5: Gender Equality — empowering women in rural communities. ● SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth — fostering local entrepreneurship. ● SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production — promoting sustainable product utilization. The Women's School of Kandangrejo exemplifies how local potential can be transformed into a sustainable, women-driven economic force.

61	 	Akashatani Program: Empowering Young Farmers in Ringinarum Village Ringinarum Village in Kendal Regency covers an area of 255 hectares, with 163 hectares of productive farmland. About 84% of its 4,773 residents work as farmers, primarily cultivating corn and red onions. Despite its agricultural potential, the village still faces challenges such as limited application of appropriate technology, underutilized agricultural waste, and a lack of digital marketing knowledge. To address these issues, the PPK Ormawa Himatepa UNIMUS team initiated the Akashatani Program, which empowers young farmers through the Sanggar Tani institution and the 3RUM initiatives—Surya Narum, Bidarum, and Pasarum. The program focuses on developing farmer capacity in technology, management, and entrepreneurship. Surya Narum introduces solar dryer technology for efficient post-harvest processing; Bidarum trains farmers in compost and Trichoderma-based organic pesticide production; and Pasarum enhances product innovation and marketing through corn yogurt and red onion paste as value-added agricultural products. This initiative aims to establish a sustainable and adaptive young farmer institution, promote eco-friendly agricultural practices, and strengthen entrepreneurial skills among local farmers.

		Through training, mentoring, and the implementation of appropriate technology, the program seeks to create a more productive, environmentally responsible, and economically empowered farming community. The Akashatani Program aligns with SDG 2 (Zero Hunger) by supporting food security through sustainable agriculture, SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) by encouraging agripreneurship and job creation, and SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production) by promoting efficient resource management and waste utilization.
62		Mawas Warga Plus: Building a Sustainable Healthy Community in Plamongansari Plamongansari Village, located in Pedurungan District, Semarang City, has strong demographic and social potential with a balanced age distribution from children to the elderly. In 2024, the HIMAPERSA UNIMUS implemented the <i>Mawas Warga</i> program, focusing on improving elderly health through nutrition education, stroke prevention, healthy home guidance, and the establishment of an elderly park. The program successfully increased elderly nutrition knowledge by 78%, family first aid capability by 63%, and healthy home conditions by 74%, while community participation in health activities rose from 20% to 47%. However, evaluation revealed ongoing issues such as low utilization of the elderly park due to limited activities, low digital literacy hindering health information use, and minimal involvement of youth in preventive health actions. Additionally, local data showed a 15.6% anemia prevalence among adolescents and rising cases of hypertension and diabetes, increasing the risk of non-communicable diseases. To address these challenges, HIMAPERSA developed the “Mawas Warga Plus” program integrated with the “Satu Rumah Satu Caregiver (SARAGA)” innovation. The program aims to empower families by training one caregiver per household with basic health care, nutrition, and emergency response skills. It also promotes food security through the Kebun Guyub community garden and revitalizes the elderly park as an educational and productive space.

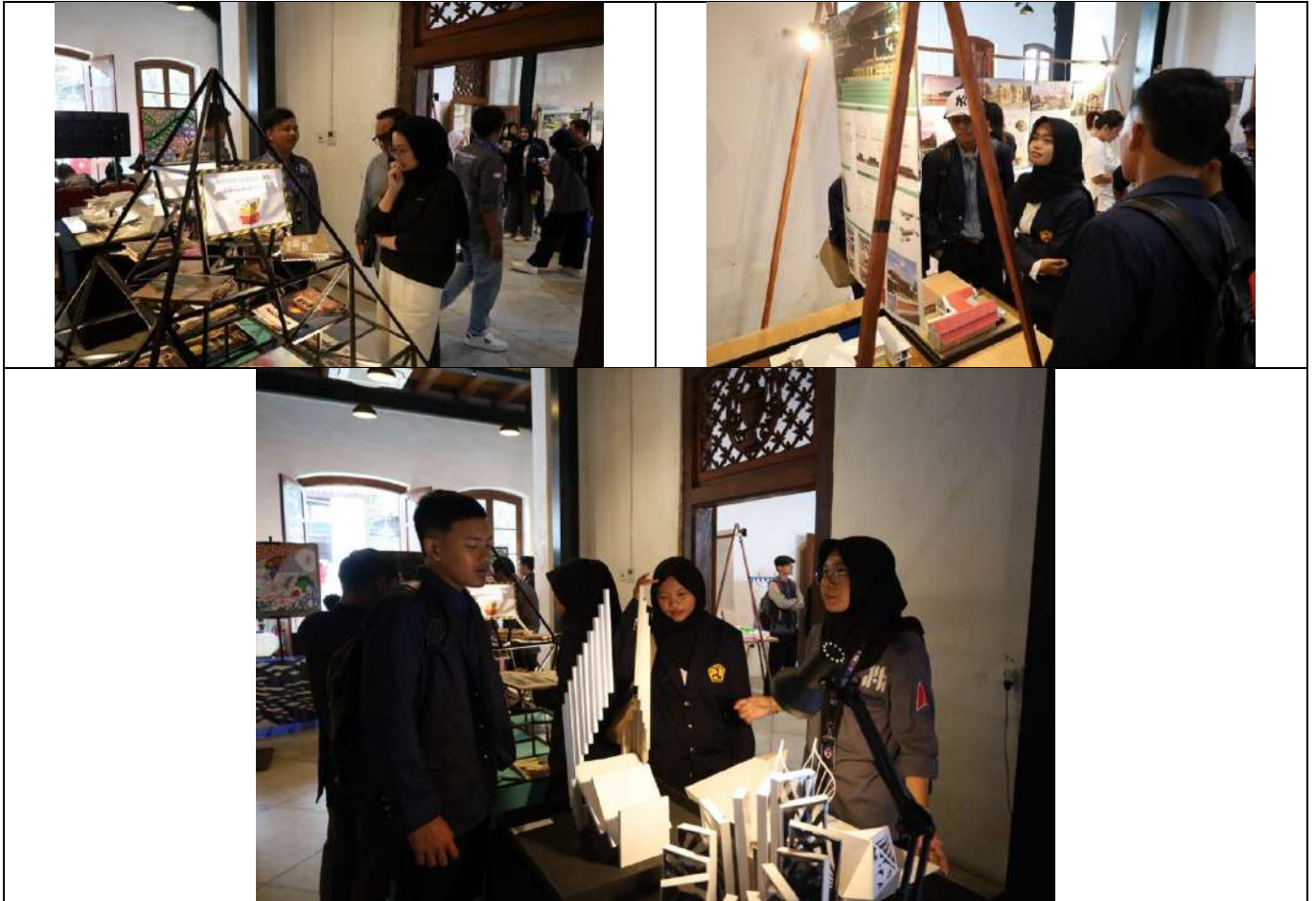

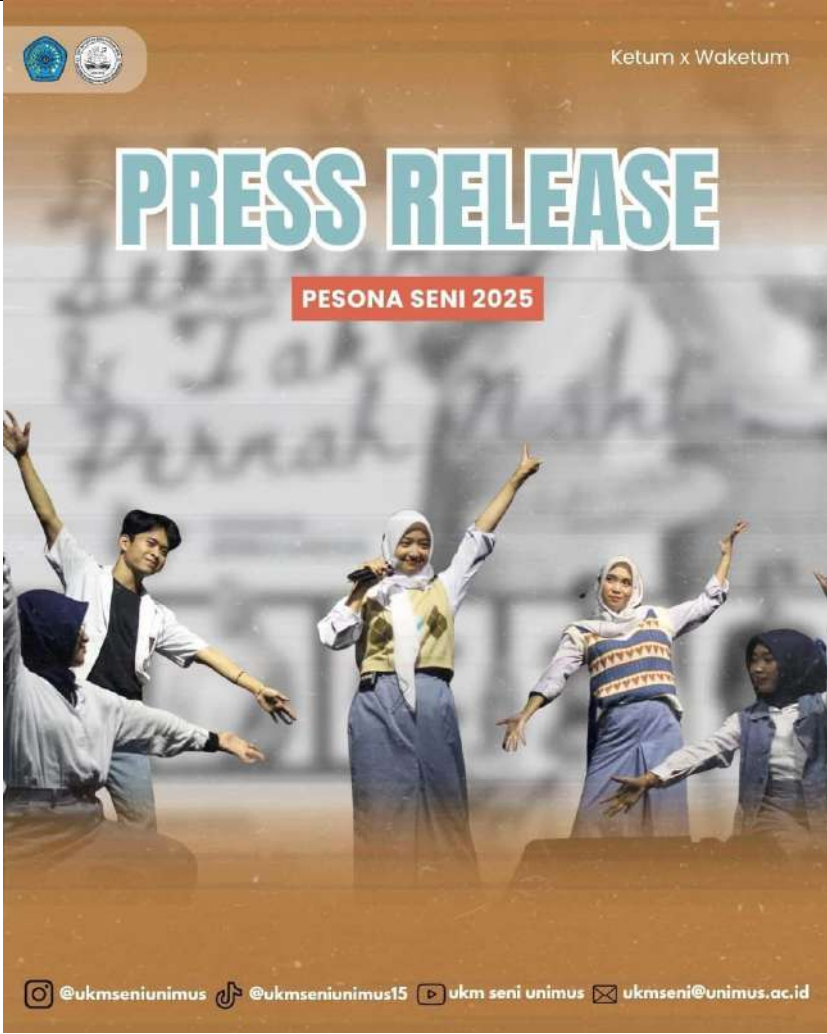

The study addresses credit risk assessment in peer-to-peer (P2P) lending, contributing to the development of a more transparent, responsible, and sustainable financial ecosystem. Specifically, it proposes a hybrid feature-selection approach using a modified version of the Grey Wolf Optimizer (GWO) in combination with an optimized Decision Tree model.

An improved Grey Wolf Optimization based heuristic initialization algorithm for feature selection in P2P lending default prediction

Description :

The study addresses key challenges in the domain of peer-to-peer (P2P) lending, particularly the difficulty of predicting default risk when dealing with datasets that contain numerous irrelevant features and high



dimensionality—commonly referred to as the “curse of dimensionality.”

In line with the Sustainability Campus vision and the principles of responsible digital innovation, this research contributes to advancing sustainable financial technologies that promote transparency, accountability, and data-driven decision-making in financial ecosystems.

To overcome the complexity issue, the authors propose a hybrid optimization algorithm that integrates the Grey Wolf Optimization (GWO) algorithm for feature selection with an improved initialization mechanism using Ant Colony Optimization (ACO). The ACO component enhances the quality of initial solutions for GWO, resulting in a more efficient optimization process and improved accuracy in default-risk prediction within P2P lending environments.

In experimental evaluations using different configurations of search agents (50, 100, 250), the improved GWO+ACO hybrid model demonstrated consistent performance with approximately 91% accuracy across all configurations, while the standard GWO varied (85%, 90%, and 91% for 50, 100, and 250 agents, respectively).

The findings indicate that the hybrid model enhances stability, precision, and computational efficiency in selecting relevant features from complex financial datasets.

This study aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 8 – Decent Work and Economic Growth, SDG 9 – Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure, and SDG 12 – Responsible Consumption and Production) by supporting ethical, sustainable, and technology-driven financial innovation that strengthens economic resilience and promotes responsible digital transformation.

Description :

The study addresses the domain of peer-to-peer (P2P) lending, specifically focusing on predicting the default risk of lenders and borrowers in P2P platforms. The research recognizes that responsible financial innovation and data-driven decision-making are essential components of building a sustainable and inclusive digital economy, in line with the Sustainability Campus framework and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)—particularly SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure), and SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production).

The key technical challenge it tackles is feature selection in datasets used for default-risk prediction in P2P lending. In such datasets, the presence of numerous, often irrelevant or redundant, features can reduce the accuracy and efficiency of predictive models. To address this challenge, the study proposes a hybrid optimization algorithm that combines a dynamic version of the Ant Colony Optimization (ACO) algorithm with the Grey Wolf Optimizer (GWO).

This hybrid algorithm is designed to improve the efficiency of the feature-selection process by identifying the most relevant and informative attributes, thereby enhancing the accuracy and reliability of default-risk prediction in P2P lending scenarios. The research is both methodological—introducing a novel hybrid algorithmic approach—and applied, demonstrating its relevance and impact in the field of sustainable financial technology.



By optimizing prediction processes within P2P lending systems, the study contributes to the advancement of ethical, efficient, and sustainable fintech practices, supporting financial inclusion and stability within the broader framework of sustainable digital transformation.

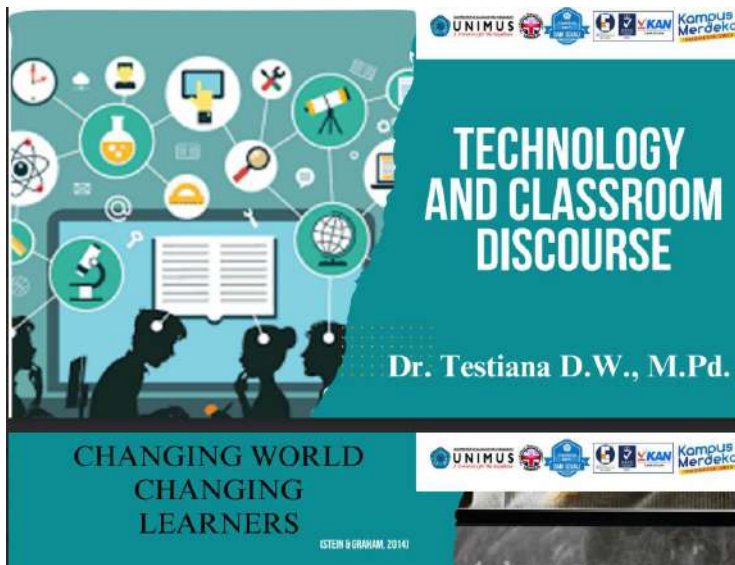

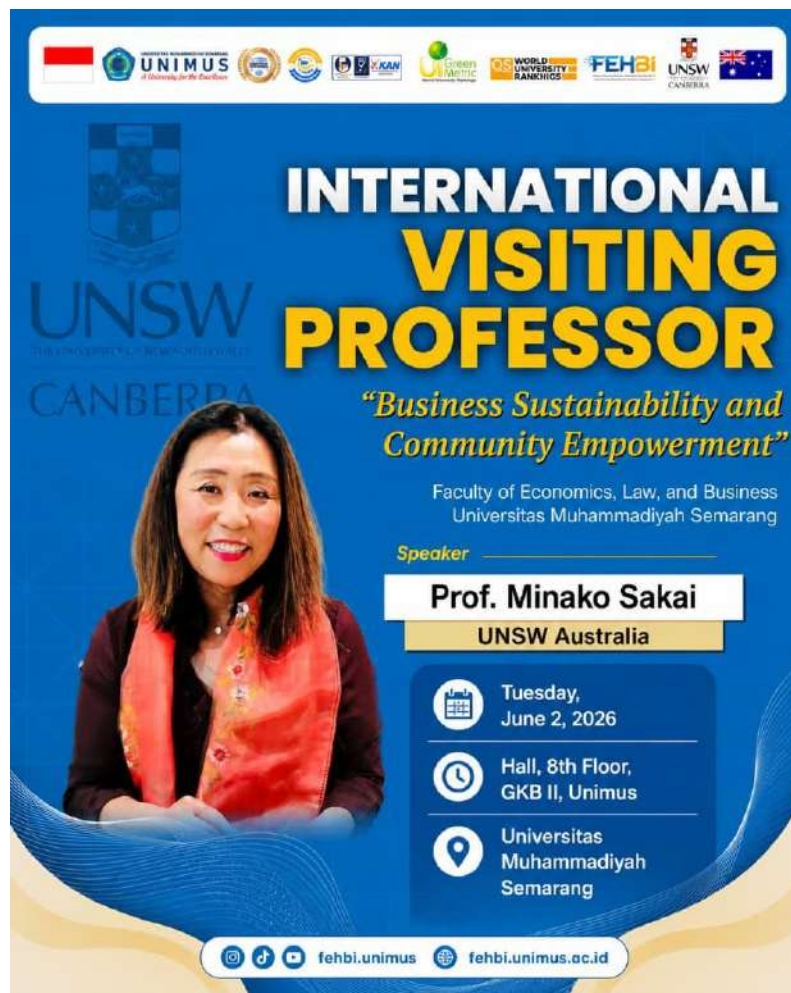

Meanwhile, the Faculty of Science and Food Technology contributes to food security, food safety, local food innovation, and environmental conservation. Overall, these programs show that education and research at Universitas Muhammadiyah Semarang are not only oriented toward academic development but also directed toward providing real benefits to society. The linkage between each program and the SDGs demonstrates that UNIMUS has strong potential to become a university that actively contributes to creating a healthier, smarter, more inclusive, productive, and sustainable society.
